"Architectural Remains of the Inner City of Polonnaruwa" By Professor D. P. Chandrasekara

This lecture explores the distinctive architectural features of Polonnaruwa period structures found within the inner city or the citadel, focusing on three key areas: the Tooth Relic Square, the Parakramabahu palace precinct, and the Nissanka Malla palace precinct. Highlighting some of the finest examples of historical building types and landscaped settings—such as the *Watadage*, brick-vaulted image houses, Council chambers, and Water gardens—the lecture offers insight into the urban and royal fabric of the ancient capital. Based on a comprehensive documentation project conducted in the mid-1990s, and a recently published book by the University of Moratuwa, this presentation brings to light the architectural legacy and cultural significance of Polonnaruwa's inner city remains.



Professor D.P. Chandrasekara is an academic at Department of Architecture, University of Moratuwa with over 30 years of teaching experience. He has authored and co-authored several books on Historic Architecture, Heritage and Housing. Currently he is the vice-president of National Trust Sri Lanka.
