Arch Ashley de Vos is a Landscape Architect, Faculty Member - University of Moratuwa and the International Centre for Conservation, Rome (ICCROM) and ACCU (Nara, Japan). He is Director Conservation to the Jetavana Monastery Conservation Project. And an advisor to the Government of India on Tourism development of the Northern Buddhist Sites. He has been awarded South Asian Architect of the Year and SLIA Special Life Time Award of Excellence. He has been Honoured with National Awards of Vidya Jyothi and Deshamanya.
