

"Koneswar Temple on Swami Rock, Trincomalee" by Angeline Ondaatjie

"Swami Rock" in Trincomalee holds immense significance as a sacred site with several names, including Konam, Makkonam, Konaparvatam, Trikutanilayam, and Dakshina Kailasam. It was among the five renowned Saiva shrines that fell victim to destruction during the Portuguese era. In July 1950, a groundbreaking discovery was made when workers excavated statues of Somaskanda Siva, the consort of Somaskanka Murthi Siva, and Chandrasekara while digging a well near Swami Rock. Additionally, statues of Ganesha, Parvati, a bird, and a Trisulum had also recently been unearthed in the vicinity. This remarkable find sparked an investigation into the origin of the statues, leading to a comprehensive exploration of the destruction of Koneswar in 1662-24 by Dr. Balendra. In 1953, Dr. Balendra delivered a captivating lecture to the RAS (Royal Asiatic Society), delving into the traditional and colonial records of Koneswar and shedding light on the temple's tragic past. Moreover, this presentation will delve into the intriguing inscription at the entrance to Fort Frederick, which played a pivotal role in the temple's reconstruction in 1952. By examining both historical and contemporary sources, the tale of Koneswar will be unveiled, highlighting its profound spiritual significance and the efforts made to preserve its heritage for future generations.
